

I have so much trouble finding time to work on a quilt, so to see so many of you show multiple quilts . . . wow, they took my breath away. Susanna Gantt had three red, white, and blue quilts she wanted to donate to Quilts of Valor, which Kay Thomas volunteered to deliver to her next sew day for Quilts of Valor. In addition, Susanna showed three quilts that Jan Bruell is donating to Community Outreach. They will be displayed in the quilt show, then donated. Good job, Jan! Also, Mickii Coutts showed a spectacular quilt made of scanned images of patches from fire stations where her husband had worked. The quilt was 100x100 inches and truly a marvel.

- Tying quilts at the Fair: Tina noticed that a couple of quilt packets were not quilt right so those will be handled separately. Thank you to all who tied quilts at the Fair, we had a successful year.

Quilt Show:

- Thursday, October 22 at 10:00 a.m. is the start of set-up for the show. It is scheduled for the entire day and will run from to 7:30 p.m. If you plan to get there close to 7 or 7:30, please call Linda Hill, Janine Walker or Sharon Meeds to let them know so if we get done early and close it up you will know that. For set up we need tall people to participate, so if you have a husband, son, grandson who can give us time on Thursday, bring them along. Thanks.
- Consignment-item people: You need a number from Sharon, you need to get a one-time license to be legal to sell your items. You must include tax in your price; for ease of accounting, please use an even amount. Contact Sharon Meeds if you have questions on this. This is a must-do thing! *** Indicate if you want CQ to mark your items down on Sunday. Note: if you do not want your items discounted, then they will stay the same. You must pick up your unsold items at teardown or they will be donated to a local thrift shop.
- Cookies can be brought any time on Thursday; however, keep in mind our cookie crew will need to put them in our table
 baskets and ready for the show, so if you can get them to me earlier, it will be much appreciated. If you cannot pre-package
 your cookies, then just bring them in a box and the cookie crew will package them. No store-bought cookies will be served,
 we are looking for homemade cookies. I will not have forks, we are looking for finger-food desserts only. Also, do not bring
 desert items that need to be refrigerated.
