

CRAZY QUILTERS OF FEDERAL WAY QUILT CHALLENGE POLAR BEARS AND HABITAT LOSS/CONSERVATION

Challenge brought by Xenia McGowan


The challenge is to make a quilt about Polar Bears and incorporate the challenges they are facing with the loss of habitat (sea ice).

- You can use any technique to make your quilt (traditional, modern, landscape, paper-piecing, fabric painting, etc.).
- A Polar Bear must be visible on the quilt. There are many fabrics that feature Polar Bears, but you could also embroider an outline. There are many ways to accomplish this requirement, just as long as the Polar Bear is visible
- There is no size limit.
- We will have an "In-house" judging at the business meeting, March 24—short turnaround time on this. Please bring your guilts that night so that we can see them all together.
- There is a chance that the quilts will be displayed at Point Defiance Zoo and Aquarium for the Earth Day celebration (April 16-17). Quilts would need to be finished, bound and have the guilter's name on the back.
- Have fun.



Sue Hopper worked on another beautiful star block, making just one large block for the whole body of the quilt; those go together pretty quickly. Jill Ellis was putting together a cute giraffe baby quilt. Marianna Garrett had her design wall up and filled by the time everyone got set up. She put together a really cool Hunter's Star, which will probably be the retreat block in March (start gathering your greens). Janie Sevala came to retreat and painted on nine sewing machines and two laptops. The cost was \$25 per machine, and everyone was very pleased with the designs. Retreat is the place to really get to know the other people in the guild. The food was fantastic, as always. It's always nice to only be responsible for one meal during the four days. Secret Pal Program will be Starting at the May Business Meeting - Jill Ellis



The Secret Pal program is a lot of fun. You are the Secret Pal for someone in the guild, and at each business meeting, you bring them a gift. You spend what you feel comfortable spending, but it doesn't have to cost a thing. One person made a quilt block each month, so at the end of the program that year, there were enough blocks for a lap quilt. You can bring something you bake, something you make, something you buy, something from your stash. What you spend is up to you, but it's not about what you spend. It's about putting a smile on someone's face, and secretly watching them as they open their gift.

If you'd like to participate, I will have forms for you to fill out at the February and March business meetings; I can also email you a form if you can't make the Feb/Mar business meeting. At the April business meeting, I will be handing participants an envelope with the information sheet for your person. You bring a gift to each business meeting. If you cannot be at the business meeting, you need to have someone else bring the present. I like to play detective, and if there is a lone present waiting to be picked up and I didn't receive a present, then it's not too hard to figure out the person missing is my Secret Pal.

Block in the Box Starting

Block in the Box is when you fill a box with fabric you want used for your 12 blocks. Inside the box is a list of instructions as to the size of your blocks, whether fabric can be added other than what you supply, etc. You make the first block yourself, and then the box goes to the next person on the list. There needs to be at least 6 people participating, which would mean you'd each do two blocks per person, as this goes for a year. Every business meeting, you return the box with the block you completed and it is passed on to another participating person. If you are interested, the March business meeting is the deadline. Rebecca Keller will be in charge of arranging this.
