an American theme

There are some things to do first.

If you've not been on any Zoom meetings, you need to download the free Zoom to your computer or your smartphone. There is the option to call in, but then we won't see your lovely face. So go here: <u>https://zoom.us/</u> and sign-up for the free account. It's quick and easy.

On Thursday, be ready to sign in at about 6:55ish or so. Xeina is our "host" for the meeting.

There are a few etiquette things.

- 1. If we all talk at the same time, nobody will hear. If you want to talk raise your hand (or a piece of fabric or something) and make sure you are in front of your camera (I sometimes forget & am waving off to the side) or USE THE 'RAISE YOUR HAND' ICON AT THE BOTTOM
- 2. Wear clothing sometimes people have been known to not have their pants on, then forget & get up (kinda like the TV commercials). We don't care what you're wearing, just be covered.
- 3. If you are not using your phone turn the sound off; listening to people's phones ring isn't fun.

Once you are on Zoom, down in the lower left-hand corner, there is a camera and a microphone. The camera needs to be on (you can also do that when you join the meeting) so we can see you. The microphone can be clicked on and it will mute you/turn you on. I always mute mine when it's on the hour, because everybody doesn't need to hear my cuckoo clock - it's annoying.

There's also, about center just over from the camera/microphone, a "chat box" thing. You can send messages to all (especially if you want to tag or share something) or you can direct messages to individuals. Make sure you pay attention to which is which. We all have the ability to have the "chat" showing up as a side-bar.

This is our first attempt to do this and share our Show and Tell. There may be glitches (sometimes my internet gets interrupted <grrrr>) but it should put you back in if you wait; if not, go out and follow the link back into the meeting.

So. Thursday, Nov. 12, 7pm is the time; your computer (or smartphone - which can have the app and be used just like your computer, complete with picture!) is the place.

NOW, on to sharing your creations at our meeting.....

- 1. YOU need to have your pictures of your show/tell in a file on your computer so that you can share them.
- 2. Host should enable "Share Screen for all Participants" (if Host is unable to, such as what occured at our guild mtg., Host can make you/Participant a Co-Host so you can Share Screen).
- 3. open your File containing your photo(s),
- 4. click on the Photo(s) you want to share (if it's more than 1 photo: click on a photo, then hold the 'command' key while clicking on additional photos you want; then click 'open');
- 5. you should see your Photo(s) on your desktop);
- 6. when you're called on, be ready to share by clicking on the green "Share Screen" link at the bottom center of your Zoom screen (I have a MacBook Pro; it could be different for IPad, etc.)
- 7. you Photos should appear, along with other items on your desktop;

- click on the Photo(s) that you want to share (or there may be another "Share Screen" link to click, on the same page as the Photos appear which will allow your Photo(s) to appear on Share Screen (I'm sorry, I don't recall);
- 9. your Photo(s) should appear on your screen for all to view;
- 10. there's a 'Quit Share Screen'' (or something like that) when you want to stop sharing your screen or Host can close your 'Share Screen'.

You will receive an email, just as you would for a reminder for the meetings. It will have the information for logging into the meeting. Unless there is a change, there is no requirement (as with some places) for a password to enter, just follow the link.

I would suggest you put it on your calendar (I use google calendar) and have it send you a reminder notice shortly before the meeting so that you don't forget to 'attend'! It was so nice to see all the faces of our friends!

Whirlwind Quilt Block ---

What follows is the example ONLY.

However - please use a white (or off-white, but not beige) as your 4-inch strip....that will give each block everybody makes a little bit of consistency.

Please note the way to cut the 7-inch blocks...and your 9-inch square can be either 4 halves of a 28-in strip set or 4 different 7-inch squares....but make sure you use the correct half of that half-square to make your



whirlwind block.

The "more white" half of your block can become another, entirely different quilt!

Square up your block at 9-inches.

Lay the 45-degree angle line corner to corner on your center seam to square up your block

this block is from Cuppa Tea Quilting, Priest River, Id

Whirlwind Quilt Block This is an example use colors of your choice Made from one strip set ! Materials: 1-4" wof strip (white) 1-1.5" wof strip (red) 1-1.5" wof strip (cream) 1-1.5" wof strip (blue) Sew all strips together as shown. white 4" strip blue 1.5" strip snew 1.5" strip red 1.5" Strip the only reason this says "red" is for the example layout Measure the width of the strip set you just made. Mine was 7" wide - so cut 4 squares that are 7" wide. Fred Cut those once on sew two pieces together first the diagnol the color "red" is just so you understand the layout & piesing Arrange so red strips point to the center. sew together Trim to 9" after you sew 2 set, sew where blue line is
