
## Sunshine Chairperson

# Retreats - Janine Walker



Hi, my name is Syndie Hagardt and I have the pleasure of being a new member of your guild. It just so happens that I am involved in a wonderful project that I would like to share with the Crazy Quilter Group.

I've been a member of West Sound Quilters (previously Port Orchard Quilt Guild in the '90's) for many years along with Washington Stars, Kitsap Quilters & The Modern Quilt Guild just recently. This call goes out to all quilters and needleworkers who might be interested in preparing a quilted wall hanging or needlework piece for the new Pines Center at Seabeck Washington.

Through the years I have attended many retreats at Seabeck Conference Center on the Hood Canal. They have made special accommodations for quilters and needle workers. They are in the process of finishing the Pines Lodge and are looking for a way to decorate the walls. I have taken on the task of helping them solicit donations of wall hanging (of many and various sizes). You can read about it here: <a href="https://www.seabeck.org">www.seabeck.org</a>

If you would like to donate a wall hanging (I'm thinking that 50"x50" will help with the bigger walls) or whatever you may have, it would be more than appreciated. These wall hangings (or wall quilts) will become the property of Seabeck Conference Center.

To answer a few questions....

- 1. All donations need to come with sleeves. If you need help, please contact me.
- 2. They are needed by July 30 or any time after that
- 3. They will all be displayed (or rotated if Seabeck gets an abundance) in Pines Lodge throughout all rooms and entryways.
- 4. These are donations and will not be returned.
- 5. You can see the display I could work out a tour if a group is interested.
- 6. Size: these are wall hangings, but there are some large walls so "regular" size wall hangings up to some place in the 50" square should work & also see No. 1 about sleeves.
- 7. No, they do not want bed guilts for beds.
- 8. You can get your donation to me I will be more than happy to pick it up. Just call 360-871-5778.

#### Rosebud Block (free pattern from Quilting Daily)

The traditional rosebud quilt block has been called many names over the years, including hummingbird, crow's foot, and a bright star. It's a delicate-looking block that's part pinwheel, with barbed tips that give you the opportunity for extra color play. Try it with a white or neutral background as shown, or sew brightly colored "flowers" on a rich black background. The block finishes at 12" square.
