

This is a "garlic knot".

You may make one, or make as many as you wish. For each one you make, your name goes in the drawing for all of them.

Directions: 8.5 inches unfinished Use happy, bright colors

You will need:

- 2 2.5" squares (depicted as yellow here)
- 6 2.5" squares (depicted as purple here)
- 2 2.5x4.5 white or white-on-white rectangles
- 4 2.5" white or white-on-white squares

Sew by row.
Iron toward the [purple] fabric.
