
# Block of the Month this is due at the December Program/Party meeting

Jill Ellis – Block of the Month Mirror Image block 253-927-1260 home, 5:30-8

For each block made, you will need

- Four 2.5 x 4.5-inch white or white-on-white pieces
- Four 2.5 x 4.5-inch print pieces
- Sew 1 and 2 together. Iron toward the print (always)
- · Sew 3 and 4 together
- Sew 1/2 to 3/4 to create the center unit
- Sew 5 to 6
- Sew 7 to 8
- Sew 5/6 to the center unit (iron away from the center unit)
- Sew 7/8 to the center unit (iron away from the center unit)

Your block should measure 8.5 inches. You can make this block in 10 minutes. Make dozens. ☺



## My First Crazy Quilters Retreat by Bobbie Mowery

I went to my first CQ retreat and had a great time. The Black Diamond Camp is a close destination, but still has a feeling of isolation and solitude. I saw deer on a couple of occasions. I think there were about 30 of us sewing our hearts out. We were two to a room (though I think a couple of sewists had their own room). Each room had a queen bed and a set of bunk beds and their own full bathroom. That was a luxury. The beds were firm, which I like. The sewing room was huge, and we each got our own table, another luxury. The sewing room and sleeping rooms were on the same level. Meals were served in a building down the hill. Though some people walked, I must confess I drove or hitched a ride with someone. Meals were ok. The camp is in the search for a

chef. They purchase frozen or canned items from Cisco and try to enhance them. For breakfast they always had oatmeal, cold cereal and yogurt, in addition to the main item. At dinner, they always had a salad bar. They also had fresh, whole fruit.

OK, now my thoughts. I loved it! It was an opportunity to get to know better some of the Crazy Quilters. I focused on projects (and got one done). Tina had a retreat block. It was just complicated enough to be a little challenging but not so much it kept people from participating. I made three and then Jill brought one back to me that I did not have right. I cannot remember who won all the blocks. Tina also had a game for us to play (voluntarily, of course). We played two rounds, each starting out with three fat quarters. That was a lot of fun and much laughter. I loved the feeling of camaraderie and sharing. We had show and tell. We have some very talented quilters in the Guild, and it was fun to see their projects. It was also fun to walk around and see what people had up on the design boards. Again, beautiful and creative. I really appreciated the way everyone helped each other, either with an opinion, figuring out fabric combinations, constructing backing, etc.

Oh, and the best part – I purchased one of Claudia's (Kathy's sister) pin cushions and Patty won the silent auction on one of Claudia's pin cushions and then allowed me to buy it from her (and donated the money to the Guild!). So, now I have two. If you have not had a chance to see Claudia's creations, maybe Kathy can convince Claudia to do a program on her pin cushions and give us some tricks on how to make one ourselves. Claudia creates works of art.

I am planning to go again, next year, maybe even to two!
