Block of the Month this is due at the December Program/Party meeting

### Jill Ellis – Block of the Month Mirror Image block 253-927-1260 home, 5:30-8

For each block made, you will need

- Four 2.5 x 4.5-inch white or white-on-white pieces
- Four 2.5 x 4.5-inch print pieces
- Sew 1 and 2 together. Iron toward the print (always)
- Sew 3 and 4 together
- Sew 1/2 to 3/4 to create the center unit
- Sew 5 to 6
- Sew 7 to 8
- Sew 5/6 to the center unit (iron away from the center unit)
- Sew 7/8 to the center unit (iron away from the center unit)

Your block should measure 8.5 inches. You can make this block in 10 minutes. Make dozens. ©


### Visit to Quilt Stores - Old and New


### **Bobbie Mowery**

My friend, Neta Welever, came to visit from Sunday, October 19, through Sunday, October 31st. I loved having her visit. She is an easy guest to have. During her time with me, we decided to visit the two new stores in Tacoma and Lakewood.

Of course, we also added a couple of other stores (since they were on the way). Carol Cowan joined us in our travels. Our first store was Shibori Dragon in University Place. Neta had never been to the store but had purchased items from them at Sewing Expo and over the internet. Carol hadn't been to the store in years, and I hadn't been there since they had moved around the corner from their previous location. The store is small but packed with luscious fabric, lots of Sashiko patterns, kits, and supplies. Becky, and her husband, Joe, own the shop, was there by herself and is always personable, helping us to find things. The samples on the wall are an inspiration. Next stop was a new shop, Pieced Together Quilts, 11116 Gravelly Lake Dr SW, in Lakewood. If you remember when Shibori Dragon was in Lakewood, this is in the same shopping center as Shibori was and across from their previous location. The shop has been open for about 3 months. It has a good selection of fabrics and lots of samples on the walls. One sample was a quilt by Jen Kingwell, it was beautiful, so of course, I had to buy the pattern. They are currently recruiting part-time help.

Our next stop was also a new shop, All Things Sew, 14125 Pacific Ave S, Ste D, Tacoma. For some reason I had it in my mind that this was near the Tacoma Mall. But, it's in Parkland. This store is a





Nolting Longarm Machine shop. They also sell entry level sewing machines. They do have a modest amount of fabric and are expecting shipments of more to arrive. They have Open Sew times (I think there is a modest fee for use of their space, e.g., \$10 / person); they have a Nolting longarm machine set-up that people can rent for \$15 / hour (I'm not sure of the training requirements to use this machine); they repair sewing machines, including featherweights; they also offer classes – if any of you know Carol Maddox, she teaches classes there.

Since we were already on Hwy 512 to go home, Carol Cowan suggested we stop at Quilting Fairy on Meridian, Puyallup. That is one of my favorite shops and Neta is familiar with it too. Carol didn't have to twist my arm too much. Of course, there, the first stop is the clearance section in the back. She had some great buys and we all ended up spending some money. I also bought the background for the Jen Kingwell pattern I had purchased at Pieced Together. So, now just to get started on it.

The day ended with dinner at my house. It was a fun day with friends.
