February Business meeting - Elections and Bylaw update proposals!

A nominating committee got together and has come up with a slate of officers. If you want to throw your name into the hat for President, VP (programs), Secretary or Treasurer, please let Kathy Wyckoff know. The group came up with people willing to fill those positions. Elections will be February 24th.

Bylaws: Proposed to

- 1. Eliminate the \$5/year addition to dues to receive a printed newsletter. Printed newsletters will go out to our "homebound" members (ok, just because we are all staying home to help keep ourselves and others safe is NOT what is meant). "Homebound" members would include people like Bety Howard and Gladys Johnson. Everyone else appears to have email or computer access where they can receive the newsletter or read it on the Guild website (thanks to the wonderful website work by Sue Hopper).
- 2. Remind our "Honored Members" that it is an option to not pay dues; but that by paying it does help the Guild and therefore benefits all of us, if we all pay our dues. Our dues work out to

- \$2.50 a month; you can't get a cup of coffee for that. And we all know the cost of fabric these days. That being said, our Honored Members have a choice.
- Retreats: Non-members (those who don't pay dues) and guests of CQ members can attend one (1) retreat per fiscal year (May 1-April 30) at the same rate as CQ members.
 Non-members/guests of members may attend more than one retreat per fiscal year, HOWEVER, they will be paying the increased rate of \$10 more per day (which would currently be \$90/day).

The retreat bylaws have been in for a while (we couldn't find a printed copy from when they were added) and the plan, going forward, is to follow the bylaws.

Challenge restrictions: <u>Due September 2022 Business Meeting</u>

- Must use a variety of fabric types: velvet, satin, cotton, polyester, etc.
- Must use embellishments, e.g., embroidery, lace, ribbon, beads, etc.
- Must use embroidery, either hand or machine embroidery or a combination of the two
- Must be a minimum of a 15" square (no limit on larger)

We are supplying a baggie of materials. Feel free to exchange with others or use items out of your stash. Donate or pass on (not back to the Guild) whatever you do not use.
