Community Service Quilts

Xenia was able to donate 10 quilts to NW Medical Specialties last Wednesday!! We are so glad they will go to those who need the comfort of a quilt as they travel their path through their cancer treatments.

from Joan Bassen: I have to confess that I am terrible about keeping in touch. Wanted to let you know that all of the quilts I received for donation did get delivered. I was mistaken in the fact that the Afghans housed in that building were being housed by King County not Cathlic Community Services. The County has that building until March. While waiting to get the contact completed, I was able to sandwich and quilt 3 twin size quilts so we ended up donating 43 quilts and 23 pillow cases. 6 of those quilts were what I would call extra large. The man that received the quilts at the building is a quilt lover. He informed me that he and his wife have one that was given to them when they got married and is very much treasured so was very grateful to accept the donation and said they would probably disappear in about 5 minutes. Thank you to the club for having the quilts available to donate when there was a cause that would really appreciate them.

And speaking of Community Service quilts - we still have about 22 waiting to be quilted. If you have a quilting machine (these are large quilts!) and are willing to help, just let Sharon Meeds or Tina McCarter know & they'll be glad to get you one (or more!) from storage.

And, if you've taken one and are working on it, or have finished it, just bring it back to a Guild meeting and give it to Tina!

February Business meeting - Elections and Bylaw update proposals!

A nominating committee got together and has come up with a slate of officers. If you want to throw your name into the hat for President, VP (programs), Secretary or Treasurer, please let Kathy Wyckoff know. The group came up with people willing to fill those positions. Elections will be February 24th. (see list of Nominees in the Minutes)

Bylaws: Proposed to Article 3: Membership

Section 1, letter C: Remind our "Honored Members" that it is an option to not pay dues; but that by paying it does help the Guild and therefore benefits all of us, if we all pay our dues. Our dues work out to \$2.50 a month; you can't get a cup of coffee for that. And we all know the cost of fabric these days. That being said, our Honored Members have a choice.

Section 2, letter C: Eliminate the \$5/year addition to dues to receive a printed newsletter. Printed newsletters will go out to our "homebound" members (ok, just because we are all staying home to help keep ourselves and others safe is NOT what is meant). "Homebound" members would include people like Bety Howard and Gladys Johnson. Everyone else appears to have email or computer access where they can receive the newsletter or read it on the Guild website (thanks to the wonderful website work by Sue Hopper).

Article 5: Election & Term of Office

<u>Section 1, letter C</u>: The Election of Officers **shall take place at the business meeting at the end of March**, which is 2 meetings before the officers are "installed". Elections may be by consensus of the membership present or may be by secret ballot. Secret ballots will be tabulated by the members of the Nominating Committee.

Article 10: Retreats The retreat bylaws have been in for a while (we couldn't find a printed copy from when they were added) and the plan, going forward, is to follow the bylaws Sub-letter A: Non-members (those who don't pay dues) and guests of CQ members can attend one (1) retreat per fiscal year (May 1-April 30) at the same rate as CQ members. Sub-letter B: Non-members/guests of members may attend more than one retreat per fiscal year, HOWEVER, they will be paying the increased rate of \$10 more per day (which would currently be \$90/day).

It is February and I cannot get the song, "Love is in the air," out of my mind.

We have been under restrictions for two awfully long years, either our mobility has been restricted, the Governor has mandated mask wearing, or we have been highly encouraged to vaccinate. I think we are all tired of this and just want things to get back to "normal." I have concluded that we have a new normal and will need to adjust our lives to accommodate these new things.
