Crazy Quilters year for many things is a fiscal year....May 1 through April 30.

Crazy Quilt Challenge January 2022

Challenge restrictions: <u>Due September 2022 Business Meeting</u>

Challenge restrictions: Due September 2022 Business Meeting

- Must use a variety of fabric types: velvet, satin, cotton, polyester, etc.
- Must use embellishments, e.g., embroidery, lace, ribbon, beads, etc.
- Must use embroidery, either hand or machine embroidery or a combination of the two
- Must be a minimum of a 15" square (no limit on larger)



This year I decided to try hand applique. I had purchased a kit and downloaded all the pages to a quilt called Delft Blue. I thought that

was all I had done. Imagine my surprise when I finally found my tote and realized that I had cut all the fabrics into the pieces and put them in baggies by block number. My friends told me that was only the first step. I realized I am inept at this project and do not

have a clue where to go from here or even the sequential steps that follow. (Something like the time I went to a Jacqueline DeJong class, but that is another story, so I will save that for another time). So, I have done step two, which is to copy and tape together the layout for each block. Now, I am stuck again until my next meet up.



What challenges are you working on this year? Have you found a friend, or group to meet with that can help you? What skill(s) do you have that you are greatly confident in and that you would be willing to share with others? I am sure there are those who would love to have you teach them that skill.

Crazy Quilt Challenge: There are still a few starter kits available. I will be out of town for the next couple of weeks, but will bring them to the next meeting. The deadline isn't until September so you have plenty of time.
