Community Service Quilts

We have some quilts ready to quilt! Some are on the larger size and come with everything but the binding (although we can get you binding in some 'basic' colors). If you would like to help quilt one of our "ready to go" quilts, please contact Tina McCarter or Sharon Meeds.

These are the sizes of the 13 quilts that have a top, batting and backing & are just waiting for a volunteer to guilt them:

44x50	51x62	60x80	62x68	64x70	66x60something	52x44
49x73	80x80	49x61	52x50	66x57	46x56	

Because it's becoming harder to get our community service quilts quilted, we are going to ask a few things of our donations:

1. Community Service quilts need to be given to us completed - we don't need just the top you

- made we need a completed and bound quilt.
- 2. Unless you want to make & finish big guilts, we are going to start sticking with Baby Quilts (for Care Net), Lap Quilts (for our Cancer Quilt Angels) and Twin-size quilts (for groups who approach us needing quilts)
 - a. Baby quilts are typically 30 x 40 inches and crib quilts are usually 36 x 52 inches.
 - b. Our Cancer Lap Quilts are 42-45 x 60 inches.
 - c. Twin-size quilts are typically 70 x 90 inches.
- 3. IF you need backing, we have a lot of material that comes in large pieces. You will have to piece it together for your project, but it is available. You also need to contact Sharon or Tina to meet with them to get what you might like.
- 4. IF you need batting (we only have warm/natural) the same applies. This is a "flat" batting and not really conducive if you are making tied quilts, which need the 'puffiness' of a loft batting.

I have two tools that I love.

The first is the Quick Curve and Wonder Curve rulers. They were designed by Sew Kind of Wonderful which also has a ton of different patterns for the rulers. I have done the Curve it Up sampler. I had so

much fun doing this quilt and I won a ribbon at the Covington Quilt Show. Right now, I am working on Happy Together, which has children of different races. I struggled a little with fabric choices but am enjoying the process of putting the kids together.



My second favorite tool is my Accuquilt. I was not sure how much I would use it but am continually finding it handy. I have discovered Beaquilter who has designed quilts that are Accuquilt friendly. I did a sew along with her (though I did not keep up). The speed of cutting and sewing was amazing. It took me a day to cut out the entire quilt and about three days to sew it together. I am still working on my hand applique, but that is slow.... What is your favorite tool or ruler?
