The question was called by Sharon & seconded by Xenia that we do a quilt show & bazaar. 1 abstention, 1 against; the motion carried.

Bobbie & Sharon will go to the church to find out how many quilts we can have.

The May program meeting will be an ice cream social. The Guild will provide ice cream; members are asked to bring their favorite toppings.

Community Service Quilts

We thought we had all our community service quilts done - but it turns out we still have one to be quilted. It's ready to go with backing and batting. Check with Linda or Sharon if you can quilt it.

Because it became harder to get our community service quilts quilted, we are going to ask a few things of our donations:

- 1. Community Service quilts need to be given to us completed we don't need just the top you made we need a completed and bound quilt.
- 2. We have chosen to start sticking with Baby Quilts (for Care Net), Lap Quilts (for our Cancer Quilt Angels) and Twin-size quilts (for groups who approach us needing quilts)
 - a. Baby guilts are typically 30 x 40 inches and crib guilts are usually 36 x 52 inches.
 - b. Our Cancer Lap Quilts are 42-45 x 60 inches.
 - c. Twin-size quilts are typically 70 x 90 inches.
- 3. IF you need backing, we have a lot of material that comes in large pieces. You will have to piece it together for your project, but it is available. You also need to contact Sharon Meeds or Linda Palmer to meet with them to get what you might like.
- 4. IF you need batting, the same applies. This is a "flat" batting and not really conducive if you are making tied quilts, which need the 'puffiness' of a loft batting.
