Minutes from last month - Pam moved and Janine seconded and the minutes were approved as in the newsletter.

Treasurer's report - we have \$14,165.12 and the end of the month. \$4112.00 was from the Quilt Show/Bazaar. (see breakout below)

Bobbie handed out information gleaned from us about the bazaar/quilt show. There was discussion about the quilt show/bazaar. It went very well and we received many compliments. There was a several page document for us to read. It will be attached to the email the newsletter goes out in, for those who weren't able to get to the meeting.

We voted to give \$50 to the church women's group for sponsoring us so we didn't have to pay any fees to the church for usage.

We voted to "purchase" 1 or 2 tables at the Federal Way UMC Holiday Bazaar the 1st Saturday in November. It's \$20/table and we will be selling the items from our Maker's table. The church keeps track of the money, they take 15% off and we get the remainder as profit. This is a well-known and very busy Holiday Bazaar - hopefully we'll sell all of our items.

We talked about upgrading our website to something "prettier". Cost would be \$300 (or so), plus he would move us to a domain that is free for non-profit groups. Pam will check to see when our current website hosting expires. Xenia moved, Elizabeth seconded to spend \$300.

Xenia shared about Adventure Camp (pictures are further down in the newsletter). It was a success & she thanked all the people that came to sew.

October meeting - our current quilt challenge contest ends! Is your quilt ready? There are some neat prizes!

November meeting will be make it & take it. (We will not do show/tell that night) You will get more information later.

Diane Kellar shared about color theory - colors, hues, tints, and all the ways to make your quilt

eye-catching.

Community Service Quilts

We thought we had all our community service quilts done - but it turns out we still have one to be quilted. It's ready to go with backing and batting. Check with Linda or Sharon if you can quilt it.

Because it became harder to get our community service quilts quilted, we are going to ask a few

things of our donations:

- 1. Community Service quilts need to be given to us completed we don't need just the top you made we need a completed and bound quilt.
- 2. We have chosen to start sticking with Baby Quilts (for Care Net), Lap Quilts (for our Cancer Quilt Angels) and Twin-size quilts (for groups who approach us needing quilts)
 - a. Baby quilts are typically 30 x 40 inches and crib quilts are usually 36 x 52 inches.
 - b. Our Cancer Lap Quilts are 42-45 x 60 inches.
 - c. Twin-size quilts are typically 70 x 90 inches.
- 3. IF you need backing, we have a lot of material that comes in large pieces. You will have to piece it together for your project, but it is available. You also need to contact Sharon Meeds or Linda Palmer to meet with them to get what you might like.
- 4. IF you need batting, the same applies.

2023 BLOCK QUILT CHALLENGE ENDS NEXT MONTH


