Secretary's Minutes for March 2024 business meeting - Xenia McGowan

The meeting was called to order by President, Bobbie.

Bobbie introduced our officers.

Minutes from February - Kathy Wyckoff moved & Linda Palmer seconded that they be accepted as written. Motion passed.

Treasurer's report is still pretty current and is in the newsletter.

Old Business:

- There are bookmarks for the Quilt Show on the tables
- Jill is our Quilt Show / Bazaar publicity chairperson
- Linda Palmer has forms for both the Quilt Challenge and the regular Quilt show submission
- there was a short discussion about the Quilt show

Jill presented the April Block of the Month – make as many or as few as you wish. YOU must bring them with you to get your name in the drawing.

Jill - UFO Challenge - if you're participating, you need to measure all four sides of your totally completed project. (finished, quilted and bound - label optional). Give Jill a slip of paper with your name & the measurements.

Maddie - Block in a Box: she spoke about rules and showed some examples.

- 1. must be in a big enough container for your material and completed blocks
- 2. instructions could be appliques, could be pattern, could be specific block your decision
- 3. must be sure to give complete instructions use my fabric, use only my background, etc. You can be as explicit as you want. Give parameters
- 4. You will make one block and bring the box back to the next person
- 5. at the end of the time you will have however many blocks as there are people in the group. Sign-up will be at the April meeting; you will bring your boxes in May.

Baby Quilt challenge (ends in April - all quilts must be returned totally completed). Gail explained we will have a Baby Shower program in April and hopefully somebody from Care Net will be with us.

New Business:

Janine talked about retreats - one begins tomorrow. She has sign-up sheets for the next ones.

Sharon spoke about dues - \$30 for the year. Your dues are due by April 30th. You can bring your check/cash to the meeting or mail it to Sharon.

Bobbie brought up that she bought 2 rolls of batting from Warm Company. \$86 roll for use in our Community Service quilts. We will reimburse the payment.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Our Block of the Month event is back...you can make as many of the blocks, following directions given, as you wish and you get one chance for each block to win all the blocks from everybody else. Blocks are due at the April meeting. You must bring your completed blocks in order for your name to go in for the drawing.

Block of the Month: 3D Blockhead - Jill Ellis, 253-686-9372

For each block you make, your name will be in a drawing. One person will win all of the blocks.



You will need:

- 1 6.5-inch square in a bright print
- 1 6.5-inch square, black
- 1 7-inch square, black
- 1 7-inch square, white or white-on-white

Place the 7-inch white and black squares right-sides together. Draw a diagonal line on the back of the white square. Sew 1/4-inch on either side of the line to make two half-square triangles. Press toward the black. Trim each square to to 6.5 inches. When sewing together, press toward the squares, not the half-square triangles. Your block will be 12.5 inches.

Community Service Quilts

We thought we had all our community service quilts done - but it turns out we still have one to be quilted. It's ready to go with backing and batting. Check with Linda or Sharon if you can quilt it.

Because it became harder to get our community service quilts quilted, we are going to ask a few things of our donations:

- 1. Community Service quilts need to be given to us completed we don't need just the top you made we need a completed and bound quilt.
- 2. We have chosen to start sticking with Baby Quilts (for Care Net), Lap Quilts (for our Cancer Quilt Angels) and Twin-size quilts (for groups who approach us needing quilts)
 - a. Baby guilts are typically 30 x 40 inches and crib guilts are usually 36 x 52 inches.
 - b. Our Cancer Lap Quilts are 42-45 x 60 inches.
 - c. Twin-size quilts are typically 70 x 90 inches.
- 3. IF you need backing, we have a lot of material that comes in large pieces. You will have to piece it together for your project, but it is available. You also need to contact Sharon Meeds or Linda Palmer to meet with them to get what you might like.
- 4. IF you need batting, the same applies.

A UFO is defined as a project you have cut out and/or starting sewing.


