Sew You Oughta Know

The Red, White and Blue request

Jack Chandler of Milton, has asked us if we could make some quilts for the 2nd of the 75th Ranger Regiment. They are getting ready to deploy to the Middle East. (Some of you may have heard his request if you were at the class in Milton in May)

The quilts will be given to the wounded when they are sent home to Madigan hospital.

He asked for Red, White and Blue quilts that are either lap or twin size. He would like the blue to be medium or dark blue like our flag. He also wants the backing to be dark cotton, no flannel or fleece. He would love if we could make 20 quilts, but will be more than happy with how ever many we can give to him

The Regiment will be coming home next April so he would like the quilts by the, but if we could give him some earlier he will take them.

This is a different program than the Quilts of Valor, as Jack's group will be specifically handing these out to the group of soldiers indicated.

Mary Ann Morris is our "go-to" person for this; if you have any questions, please check with her. Also, these will need a label so please check if the label might need to be on a "front" corner so it doesn't irritate a wounded soldier's body.
