Retreats: We had to pay "twice"; once for dates for 2019 and then again for dates to hold 2020. This all came from the current budget. It shouldn't happen again since we now have the 2020 dates held. In 2020 we should be putting the down payment for the 2021 retreat dates.

Bylaw changes suggested by the Executive Board

Article 3, Membership, Section 2 – to add the following sub letter "D":

Membership allows each person to participate in Guild things such as voting, the Membership Badge contest, and other Guild events. Members are not required to attend meetings.

Article 3, Membership – to <u>REMOVE</u> Section 3 which allows people to visit twice before becoming "dues paying" members.

Article 8, Meetings – to add a Section 2 which would read:

All visitors are required to pay \$5.00 to attend meetings. This fee will be collected as they enter the meeting room. People may visit and pay this for as many meetings as they like. They are not required to become members.

The above are the only things that required the Guild to vote on.

The following are from the Addendum, which is attached to the Bylaws but is strictly informational and does not need to be voted upon.

Under #6 – Community Outreach

removed KCMS – as far as we are aware, there has been nothing brought to send to them (we had decided on toiletries) for ages.

Remove #10 – Friday Friends. If this is going to continue, then it needs to be updated as to where/when the group has decided to meet.

Updated #12 – this is in regards to our Liaison with Christ Lutheran Church.

Remove #18 – Quilts at the Puyallup Fair. It is becoming harder and harder to fill the slots of our given times. It is not fair for a few ladies to end up taking multiple shifts to get the times covered. As of the May 9, 2019 meeting, it also sounds like this will not be continuing at the Western Wa State Fair (the Puyallup in Sept.)

And, finally, one more item.... Membership Cards. Stores are no longer recognizing Guild membership cards for getting any type of discount. Joann's (who was probably the biggest chain doing so) stopped over a year ago.

The proposal would be to no longer print Guild membership cards – if they aren't being used for anything, then it saves the time and expense of printing them.
