Every Quilt Has a Story - Bio of Regina Liske:

Regina Liske, a native of Germany, was introduced to quilting by in-laws in North Carolina. Her European education and travels have influenced her work by blending traditional American and European art forms into a distinct personal statement.

Regina's work has been shown at juried quilting, needlework and art shows where her quilts and wall hangings have received awards and prizes. Here are a few:

- Pennsylvania Designer Craftsmen Fairs
- The "BASF/Creative Arts Guild Fiber Arts Competition" in Dalton, GA
- The "Tactile Architecture IV and VI" at the Decatur House in Washington, DC
- Eight solo exhibits at the Unitarian Church in Carmel, CA

Having lived in several different states, she now lives in Monterey, CA. Her work may be seen at area Quilt and Art shows and her studio in Monterey.
